From The Philanthropy Partner's Desk

The philanthropy pillar of Tata Consultancy Services World 10K Bengaluru, supported by India Cares Foundation, has steadily grown since the ₹ 41 lakh raised in its inaugural year in 2008. The year 2017 saw the highest amounts of funds raised in that edition – ₹ 7.55 crore! Across the 14 editions, over ₹ 49 crore have been raised for all possible causes needing support, making this platform the largest opportunity for Public Engagement by the Social Sector with the Society.

"After a hiatus of over two long years, the fact that this event was back was exciting, fulfilling and needless to say challenging. With only 60 days to fundraise, as against the usual 120-day window, we were apprehensive, however our fears were unfounded. We received an amazing response from the civil society organisations (NGOs), individual fundraisers and companies, with ₹ 3.12 crores having been raised in the span of 2 months."

In the 2022 edition, 57 civil society organisations participated to garner support for their work. Immeasurable impact will be felt in the years to come – for eg: funds raised will be utilised to provide wheelchairs, impart education after a gap of two years, train women trained earn their livelihoods, etc.

20 companies fielded 30 teams, 76 individual fundraisers campaigned; 2,618 individuals contributed; monks, teachers, children, visually impaired, intellectually impaired, transgender, employee groups and volunteers - community members at all levels engaged!

Additionally, 434 runners made top-up donations totalling up to ₹ 1.92 lakh while registering for the event. This edition we saw a greater involvement from Bengaluru's run clubs, with increasing number of runners taking a cause to donate/fundraise.

The need is for the social sector to raise increasing amount of funds at the earliest for their regular projects & programmes, especially after concentrating on COVID relief work over the last 2 years. Funds are needed to continue supporting communities who have lost livelihoods, to educate children using online and offline methods, to address health issues and many other problems society has faced, and continues to face.

"Over the years, civil society organisations (CSOs/NGOs) that have taken this platform seriously have raised significant sums of funds for their work, built their visibility in society and increased their donor base. The 2022 edition was even more significant to raise funds, and we have seen an increase in the ticket size of donations as society has understood the vital work being done by the social sector for the less privileged of our country and that this platform provides a trustworthy method to make a difference. Our deepest wish is for many more CSOs to understand and utilise the platform to the fullest and more people to know the difference they can make!"



Care Champions are individuals from varied walks of life - Trustees, corporate CXOs, staff of the non-profits, individuals from the community served, committed donors, volunteers, students – with a single-minded focus of showcasing to the world possibilities achievable when the right efforts are made. To them, the process is of paramount importance – of going through the highs, lows, negativity, failure and of course gratitude when others believe in the Care Champion and the cause he/she has chosen. Champions extend beyond their limit and make it possible.

Since its inaugural year in 2008, the TCS World 10K Bengaluru platform has seen over 200 individuals as Care Champions, taking on targets of a lakh and above, and almost always achieving beyond 150% beyond the target!

At the 2022 edition, 15 individuals Care Champions have in total have raised ₹ 86.89 lakh for 13 CSOs. One of the unique aspects of the 2022 edition was that we had Mr T C Meenakshisundaram chose 4 CSOs and has raised a minimum of ₹ 1 lakh for each chosen CSO, a first for the platform. He has cumulatively raised ₹ 10.90 lakh at this edition.

CARE CHAMPIONS

CARE CHAMPIONS PLATINUM

Care Champion Platinum are individuals who have taken on a target of ₹ 10 lakh for their cause. Year on year these individuals have broken records in fundraising. This year we had one Care Champion Platinum, who has raised 400% of the minimum target!

CARE CHAMPIONS DIAMOND

Care Champions Diamond are individuals who have taken on a target of ₹ 5 lakh for their cause. Two individuals have raised ₹ 10,23,182 in this category which proves their efforts are like 'Precious Diamonds' for the CSOs they have chosen to support.

Care Champions GOLD

Care Champions Gold are individuals who take on a minimum target of ₹ 2.50 lakh for their chosen cause. We had 3 individuals raising ₹ 16,07,000, with one fundraising ₹ 10.90 lakh for 4 CSOs.

CARE CHAMPIONS SILVER

Care Champion Silver are individuals who take on a target of ₹ 1 lakh for their chosen cause. This edition saw 9 individuals raising ₹ 15,49,528, almost double the set target!





Binu Verma was brought up in Delhi and started her career as a training and development employee at a corporate. Binu served in the corporate sector was nearly 15 years. After a point of time, she realised her life has a larger purpose than a conventional desk job. Instead of dedicating her life to training young Indians to join the workforce, she decided to take the less traversed path with her husband, Ramesh Balasundaram, and together they started Bal Utsav in 2009; with the mission to empower children towards a better future.

In the year 2013, the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013 came into existence. Her passion for working for her clan gave her an opportunity to address cases pertaining to Sexual Harassment. Since then there has been no looking back. She is on board with nearly 80 plus corporates across the country supporting their Internal Committees in creating a safe working environment for women employees.

Being a Social Entrepreneur, she has an immense responsibility towards the beneficiaries. In the initial years of Bal Utsav, she faced multiple challenges to raise resources. There were situations where she had a solution, however no support. It was an uphill task to attract investment but over time she was able to demonstrate how her programs were transforming government schools and their model of Sampoorna Shaala & iShaala for children's education was replicable. She also believes in strengthening the ecosystem by providing vending machines for sanitary napkins and incinerators for napkin disposal in schools.

Binu's advice to young girls is, "Never give up and don't let your dreams die. Be focussed and fulfil them one at a time." ~ Binu Verma, co-founder of Bal Utsav based in Bengaluru.

"One day you will be a memory for others, so make sure you become the best one" is the adage Sudhir follows. Working with 3M India Limited, a company known for its innovation, Sudhir was forced to register for the TCS World 10K by a colleague in 2014. When he completed his first run under 60 mins, he took up distance running seriously. He joined the elite running group PaceMakers in 2015 to be formally trained and disciplined.

"During the TCS World 10K Bengaluru 2015 build-up, Mrs. Shubhashini Vasant, wife of martyred Colonel Vasant Venugopal and the founder of the organization Vasantharatna Foundation for Arts, met runners during our training at Kanteerava Stadium. She explained the work done by her foundation and the background which gave her the motivation to start this foundation. She appealed to runners to support her organization by raising funds during the 2015 edition."

Sudhir recounts "As a child and later as teenager and thereon, I always had this urge to be associated with the Armed Forces. Call it the awe for the uniform or the sheer goosebumps on hearing stories of valour, I have always wanted to be associated with the forces. I saw this as an opportunity to fulfil my dream and immediately approached Shubhashiniji who put me onto India Cares.

When the 2022 edition of the on-ground run was announced, I saw the event had used me as their poster boy on their twitter posts, and I got charged up. This time I had raised the bar and doubled my target to raise ₹ 5 Lakhs. Thanks to the runners' meeting organised before the event wherein India Cares played a video appeal by a runner that gave me a new idea of reaching out to my loved ones and well-wishers. The last 2 weeks of the fundraiser campaign was like a nail-biting movie or high-tension sporting event! Finally, I crossed my target amount thanks to 152 angels of mine.

On May 15th 2022 as I walked and jogged the entire 10 km, it was double serendipity and emotional for me - first for finishing the 10KM after a gap of 4 years, and second that I did this for all the Veer Naaris and their families for whom I was raising funds. I urge all the runners out there to pick up an NGO of their choice and aim to raise funds at the next edition of the TCS World 10k, and double their happiness while crossing the finish line."



Amar Seva Sangam was established at Ayikudy (Tamil Nādu) in 1981 by Padmashri awardee Shri S Ramakrishnan, who became quadriplegic during a Naval officers' selection. He joined by Shri S Sankararaman, affected by Muscular Dystrophy and who is a Chartered Accountant by profession. It is a pioneer institution in the field of Disability Management and has been rendering noble services for the differently abled relentlessly for the last 40 years, directly benefiting 16000+ service users in over 900 villages in Tenkasi, Tirunelveli, Tuticorin and Virudhunagar districts of Tamil Nadu. The institution provides campus and village-based rehabilitation to the disabled. Sangam provides an integrated approach to empowerment of the disabled with Rehabilitation, Education, Skill Development and Rural employment.

Amar Seva Sangam started Siva Saraswathi Vidyalaya in 1986, an integrated school with normal and disabled children from lower income families, to provide education with play school, nursery, primary and higher secondary school with current strength of more than 650 students. Over 5800 children have successfully completed their primary education and in the past four decades nearly 585 disabled students have pursued higher education to take up employment in Government and private institutions.

"Amar Seva Sangam has participated in the TCS World 10K Bengaluru since 2014 and has been able to create public awareness of our programs and the rights of the differently abled as equal citizens. Right to Live's Fundraising Story at TCS World10K 2022

Right to Live (an initiative of Kote Foundation), over the years, has recognized and addressed the link between illiteracy and systematic poverty and has decided to make a lasting impact on children's lives by providing access to quality education and healthcare.

Though Right to Live's interest in the TCS World10K started about 2 years ago, however due to the pandemic, participation wasn't possible. But got an opportunity for the first time this year to take part in the 2022 edition and to raise funds towards empowering rural Government school students.

Right to Live's fundraising efforts in the TCS World 10K event started in April in multiple ways. In the months of April and May 2022, a first-time participant community-service organization, Right to Live's fundraising initiative began with much excitement and enthusiasm. A banner was created on the Right to Live homepage with a direct link for donations to the India Cares website which hosted our campaign to fundraise - School Digitization project. This project includes the set-up of a full-fledged computer lab and smart classrooms across Government schools in Karnataka.

This event was also promoted across social media platforms to ensure maximum outreach to friends and followers. Right To Live had also reached out to its corporate partners explaining the multiple benefits they get team building activities through participating in running, company branding via the platform, while supporting a social cause through Right To Live.

Right to Live, in their first-time effort, raised ₹ 6.50 lakhs respectively from corporate companies - Opteamix and Ocwen Financial Solutions with good participation strength across the Open 10K and Majja Run categories.

Financials of Fundraising at 2022 Edition



When a Civil Society Organisation - CSO/ NGO organizes an event to raise funds and build their visibility, the effort into doing this method of fundraising gives them a 40% return on the higher side.

And at the TCS World 10K Bengaluru platform, the returns are as high as 90%! The thought through and structured category wise opportunities to leverage the event by a Civil Society Organisation (CSO/NGO) allows every participating organisation, individual, group of people and/ or company to maximize their fundraising potential for the chosen cause. There are three main categories through which funds can be raised- Care Champions, Corporate participation & individual crowd fundraising.

Of the total funds raised by the participating non-profits, the management cost for India Cares to support the CSOs from April to June 2022 was 5.50%. 13% of the funds passed through India Cares accounts and 87% was directly donated by the donor to the CSO.

51% of all the retention is collected from the Corporate Cares participation category. 5% of funds raised through India Cares online platform is retained. 100% of all funds come into India Cares Bank account on behalf of any non-profit is passed on and there is no retention from any of the funds that the donor donates directly to the chosen cause.

The actual retention & disbursement per participating non-profit is dependent on their utilization of each of the three categories. In its role as TCS World 10K philanthropy partner, India Cares is committed to keep the overall administrative cost of fundraising to a maximum of 7%.



Green initiatives & Waste Management

Apart from being a globally acclaimed sporting event, the TCS World 10K Bengaluru is committed to putting the environment first. In the last few years, the event has proactively been implementing sustainable measures to mitigate waste generation in a mass participation event.

These initiatives primarily focus on the reduction of Plastic, Waste Segregation & Management, and distribution of surplus Food Waste in partnership with the BBMP and Hasiru Dala Innovations, a social enterprise- focused on creating better livelihoods for waste pickers. They have spearheaded and advised the event on different eco-friendly alternatives to ensure efficient waste management and over-see last-mile disposal and consequent recycling plans.

In addition to this, the event is also closely working with SWABHIMAAN, a registered Public Charitable Trust that works in the areas of education, health, interest-free microfinance, nutrition, and women empowerment among others. However, more importantly, they focus on, the conservation of the environment. For this event, Swabhimaan ensured all the surplus food from the event was distributed to deserving people across slums in Bengaluru. Approximately 1200 kits containing a juice bottle, chocolate and vadas were distributed to the kids in lower-income schools and Special Homes.

Zero to Landfill

All the waste generated from the event was either reused, recycled, composted, or processed at a biogas facility.

- All Branding and Signage banners that were put out on race day were printed on cloth. After the event, all these cloth banners were stripped off the frames and made into other utility products like bags, etc. thus extending their use for as long as possible.
- Medals were handed to runners in cloth pouches.
- Bibs at the event expo were distributed to the runners without plastic envelopes.
- Food and Refreshments on Race Day were given out in handy, reusable cloth bags.
- Runner Bags handed out at the Expo were made from Cloth
- Plastic trash bags were replaced by HDPE re-usable bags.

- Water Dispensing Stations were set up inside the Venue, in Holding Area, and at the Start/ Finish Area.
- Drinking water at the venue was provided in 100% plastic-free recyclable paper cups without any plastic lining.
- Limited mineral water bottles were provided at the refreshment area after the race to help refill when required.
- Plastic Bottles were provided on the route which were properly collected and recycled.




